outline the objective of this project
This project focuses on strengthening household resilience for people in south and south-west Tanna, through improved production and processing of coffee and other crops, intercropping of vegetables, food preservation and storage, and integration of disaster risk reduction , emphasising savings groups and financial security .
This project operates in Sanma and Shefa Provinces, working with urban and peri-urban communities in Efate and Santo to increase economic resilience and health , through improved waste management practices and business opportunities .
WVV's REACH program operates in Sanma, Shefa and Tafea Provinces and is made up of several projects aimed at reducing gender and family violence by targetting the root causes of gender inequality . This will be achieved by a variety of approaches including working with faith leaders; awareness raising; promoting healthy relationships and positive gender norms ; and working with men and boys to encourage attitudinal and behaviour change.

This project operates as part of WVV's REACH program, aiming to **transform cultural norms** that normalise the inequality of women and underpin men's violence towards women by promoting **healthy gender relations amongst young and adolescent boys and girls**, engaging men in **adapting positive masculinities**, and **supporting community leaders** to connect perpetrators and survivors to support services.

The project will seek to increase **knowledge and healthy practices** in relation to **hygiene behaviour** throughout households in the target communities on Tanna. The project will also seek to ensure that all community members have **access to safe and dignified household toilets** and to **perennial, safe drinking water**. There will be a strong emphasis on **improved WMC governance**, including the promotion of participation and leadership in WMCs by women and people with disabilities. The project will also collaborate with the **provincial Department of Water Resources** to support its ability to supervise and support rural WMC's and communities to manage their own water supply systems.

This project aims to achieve **improved health and wellbeing** for people with disabilities and women in Sanma and Torba Provinces through **access to gender-equitable and disability-inclusive WASH systems**. (This aligns with Vanuatu's National Sustainable Development Plan, National Disability Inclusive Development Policy, and the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) which Vanuatu ratified in 2008.)

This project will engage the SANMA Provincial Disaster and Climate Change Committee (PDCCC) and 2 to 3 Area Councils in SANMA to **build their capacity to appropriately respond** to local disaster events in a standardised, coordinated and socially-inclusive way.

The project will do this by ensuring that the SANMA Provincial Emergency Operations Centre (PEOC) is pre-equipped with the relevant resources needed for emergency response, while building the knowledge and confidence of those responsible for taking on PEOC roles to successfully fulfil their individual and collective duties.

The project will also encourage **consistent communication and coordination** between Area Councils, the PDCCC and PEOC in SANMA province with relevant national actors (e.g. NDMO), with a focus on ensuring that the needs of marginalised groups such as women and people with disabilities are understood and catered for and that these groups are included during disaster preparedness and response.

World Vision aimed to improve immediate and medium term access to clean water, safe sanitation facilities, and basic waste management in communities and schools hosting Ambae evacuees in the Banban and Bombua areas outside of Luganville, Santo.
